HEADTEACHER UPDATE



This term, our focus is on Learn Priory so I thought I would start with an update from each class about what they are enjoying in their learning at the moment. Our Head Pupils have visited each class and found out some of what they are learning about this half term.

Acorns are learning about special clothes in RE. They have been thinking about the special clothes they wear, for example Football Shirts!

Class 1 are enjoying reading Sally and the Limpet and in RE are finding out more about the

Jewish faith.

Class 2 have read The Owl who was afraid of the Dark and have written their own versions. Their RE is learning about the 10 Commandments.

Class 3 has been inspired by the short film clip *The Blue Umbrella*. In RE they are learning about Hindu traditions and their Gods.

Class 4 are reading special Bible verses that have significant meaning. Maths has been an exciting challenge, learning to draw line graphs.

Class 5 are learning about Lent which begins in March; they are thinking about temptation in their own lives. In English they have written their own stories based on the short film *The Piano*.

Class 6 have been looking at rites of passage in different faiths. In English they have written their own stories based on the graphic novel *Thornhill*.

WORSHIP



In worship we have been continuing to find out more about our spiritual and historical connection with Priory Church. Our school logo that we see on our jumpers, sweatshirts, book bags and letters is a reminder of something really special. The Christian cross and the salmon can also be seen on the weather vane at the top of Priory Church Tower. The salmon represents the historic tradition of presenting the Prior of the Church with the first salmon caught in the river at Christchurch at the start of the fishing season each year. This was a sign of love, respect and sacrifice.



This story from our own history here in Christchurch reminds us of the story from the Bible in Matthew, Chapter 12. The widow's offering of 2 coins inside the temple is witnessed by Jesus. Whilst Jesus saw many rich people put in large sums of money, this sacrifice is seen as greater in comparison. The two small copper coins were all she had and yet she offered them to God.

We have been reflecting on both of these stories and thinking about times when we have made our own sacrifices as a sign of love.

GAMECHANGERS - TRICK BOX



We have been celebrating our Trick Box Ambassadors who are Gamechangers on our school playground. Trick Box is our mental health and wellbeing programme to help every child develop healthy habits and strategies. Trick Box helps children to....




- Recognise and self manage emotions and develop effective coping mechanisms.
 - Develop mindful awareness and relaxation.
 - Problem solve, develop perspective and solution thinking.
- Develop communication skills and interpersonal relationships.



Our Trick Box Ambassadors help at lunchtime by taking it in turns to provide kindness at the Trick Box Bench. This group of children are trained to use some of the key tricks to promote positive feelings and creativity. We use the trick card shown here called the **Sunny Side**. This trick is for times when something might have gone wrong but you turn it into a positive so you can feel good again. They have also used their creativity by promoting and inventing their own games. Their passion for Hopscotch has started a new school craze for this traditional game which is keeping everyone active

at playtimes. I love all of their new modern twists on this game.

As a school we have also been using the *Mellow Minutes* card in our classrooms and at the start of Worship. A mellow minute allows our brains to slow down, refocus and reset. This is really useful when everything has got too busy and is a brilliant trick before bedtime. Just set yourself a minute timer and either close your eyes or focus on an object you can see; keep silent and practise breathing deeply. Just one minute of this will help you feel calmer and more relaxed. Try it and see.

Children will need to bring their own water bottles (clearly named). The bottles will be placed in their class water bottle boxes when they arrive and children will have free access to them during the disco. Our parent volunteers will also be available to fill them up should they run out of water. The bottles will be distributed just before collection time to ensure they are returned.

We have also noticed that some children can easily overheat at the disco. It is recommended that children avoid wearing fancy dress costumes, especially those with tails and masks as these outfits are quite confined.
