HEADTEACHER UPDATE



Over the course of this half term we have been inspired by the history of our school and our relationship with Priory Church. This has resulted in the children learning lots of new facts and information.

Our school logo of the salmon on the cross mirrors the weather vane on top of Priory Church tower and finding out about the origin of this symbol has been fascinating. We have discovered that way back in the Church's history, the first salmon of the season was presented to

the Prior of the church at the time. This mark of sacrifice is something we have celebrated and has helped us to think about how we can make small sacrifices of our own to show our love and friendship to others. So now when children and families look at the logo on their jumpers or cardigans or see the weather vane in the distance, they will be able to think about its significance and its wonderful history. I was also so touched to receive two special crosses made by two children in Class 2: Emily and Tobias.





From this we were delighted to discover that Evie in year 6 has a personal connection to the weather vane and golden salmon. Her great, great grandpa, William Peek, donated money towards the weather vane and therefore Evie's family has a very fond affection for our school logo.

Last week, Classes 1 - 6 visited Priory Church to learn about two key areas inside with a special meaning and history. Each class visited the Font, placed at the entrance of the church, where baptisms take place. They learnt about the special service for baptism and looked at some of the items used. The font, decorated with significant bible stories, generated much discussion from each class.

Further up the church, behind the altar, is the Great Quire. The alternative spelling of 'choir' intrigued us as did the wonderfully sculpted misericords seats which the Priory monks used hundreds of years ago during worship. At that time, Priory Church was a home to Augustianian monks who worshipped 6 times a day from very early in the morning till late in the evening. Having to stand for long periods was tiring but the misericords were a welcome perch.



We would like to say a very big thank you to both Father Charles and Harvey Gollins for organising and leading this special tour of Priory Church for our pupils.

From all this learning, one child has been inspired to make their own lego model of Priory Church. We were astounded by their creativity and attention to detail to produce such a realistic model which included the very important salmon weather vane on top of the tower. A huge well done to Barnaby, who had a little help from his brother Elliott.





WORSHIP




Continuing with the theme of fish, we looked again at our vision picture and the significance of the boat in the image.
