- World Book Day (Thursday 6th March)






WORSHIP



In worship we have been finding out about the history of the Priory Church and its significance to the town and to its people. We made a timeline and found out that in 1539 the Prior John Draper convinced King Henry VIII to let the church be given to the townspeople. From that point, the Priory Church continued to flourish and serve its community. Between 1662 and 1869 there was a school in the church called St. Michael's Loft. Priory School in Wick Lane opened in 1867 and became the main school children in the town attended.

TWYNHAM ADMISSIONS CONSULTATION

Further to my email last week regarding the consultation of Twynham's Admissions Policy 2026-2027, I would like to remind you that any comments or objections must be submitted by **Friday 24th January 2025**. The proposed policy affects pupils in year 5 and below and I would therefore strongly encourage parents of children in these year groups to carefully read the information and complete a submission. The proposed policy, specifically the over-subscription

criteria, affects Priory pupils as they will now be categorised below the other feeder schools.

Since last week, I am aware that many parents have already completed this process and submitted objections. Every completed submission counts and will be taken into account. Our sense of community is our greatest strength and therefore our collective effort regarding this change of policy will make a significant difference to the future learning journey of Priory pupils and will ensure Priory, as a Christchurch school, continues to thrive.

This week, I have met with the Diocese to seek their advice regarding this consultation as well as discussing this with the Governing Body of the school. They will both be submitting a response alongside my own objecting to the proposed changes.

ATTENDANCE AND UNIFORM

Part of our working partnership with parents, and following the Statutory Guidance from the DfE, it is our practice to regularly share attendance data with parents. This week, you will receive your child's attendance data for this current academic year. Miss Field continues as our Attendance Champion for the 2024-2025 academic year. She is available, weekly, on

Tuesdays to discuss your child's attendance or provide support. This means that she will also reach out to you if your child's attendance begins to drop. Please be assured these conversations are supportive and aimed at understanding individual circumstances in your child's best interest.

Priory pupils always take great pride in their appearance and we would like to thank families for supporting our uniform policy. As a reminder for the start of the new year, please can we ask that all nail varnish and/or bracelets are removed by Monday.

With regards to jewellery, a watch is permitted to be worn but must be removed for PE. Likewise, our policy states plain gold/silver studs (no larger than 5mm) are permitted for those children who have pierced ears, however during P.E. and swimming even these will need to be removed. On occasion, where a child's ears are still healing, children are allowed to cover their earrings with tape and the class teacher will assess whether they can fully (or partially) participate in the activity.
