



Lesson 6: Using a calendar.

Lesson intention: To learn the days of the week and the the months of the year and to be able to put them in the correct order.

Lesson Approach

To begin the lesson, show pupils the In Focus task and ask them if they know all of the days of the week and where we can find them on a calendar. Allow them to discuss this. Many pupils will learn a song for the days of the week and months of the year in reception, so ask them if they know a song to remind them. Ask pupils if they can tell you what the first day of the week is and the last. Do they know the special names for Saturday and Sunday? How about the special names for the other days of the week? Ask them to talk with their partners about this and look for opportunities to introduce the words 'weekdays' and 'weekends'.

Tell pupils your friend says that on this calendar, the day is October. What mistake did your friend make? Then tell them your friend also said he could tell how many days there were in a month by looking at the calendar. Is this true? How do you know? Ask them about when the first day of this month is and when the last day is? Discuss how many complete weeks there are in October.

Introduce pupils to the yearly calendar and ask them what this shows. Prompt them to look for similarities and differences between each month (e.g. number of days). Discuss the number of months in a year; which is the first and the last month of the year and so on. Ask them about their birthdays.

During Guided Practice, pupils are reinforcing their understanding of the week and the year, in minimal steps, from days to months/year.

Differentiation

D1

For struggling learners, provide them with a picture of the calendar that has the days of the week in full rather than abbreviated. Colouring the weekdays a different colour from the weekend can be a visual aid for pupils who are still learning about weekdays and the weekend.

D2

For advanced learners, ask them on which days of the week specific dates fall in order to deepen their understanding of the nature of calendar organisation. Also ask them if they see any patterns when they look at every Wednesday in October (increases by 7 each week) and why that is the case.

Let's Learn

- 1 There are 7 days in one week.

The days of the week are Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

The first day of the week is Monday.
The last day of the week is Sunday.

The days from Monday to Friday are called weekdays.
Saturday and Sunday are called weekends.

The day after Sunday is Monday.

Reading:

Read the 'Superheroes-All sorts' (I will put this separately on the blog).

The story says that ordinary people can be superheroes every bit as much as people like Superman. This story is very important at a tricky time like this.

I would like you to think about everyday superheroes that you know.

What makes them a hero?

I would like you to draw a picture of someone or some people who you think are everyday heroes, this might be a NHS worker you know, a Postal worker, a shop worker, a mum or a dad. Anyone that you think is an everyday hero!

Start your picture with the sentence: 'My favourite Superhero is...

Carefully write out your superhero's name, making sure it begins with a capital letter. The superhero you have chosen.

Underneath your picture write a sentence expressing your thoughts.
